Children's Champion Award


Child & Youth Friendly Saskatoon is pleased to announce that its 2016 Children's Champion Award is being presented to Bob Pringle. Bob Pringle was appointed as Saskatchewan's third Children's Advocate on November 17, 2010, and took up his role on January 1, 2011. On September 1, 2012, new legislation, The Advocate for Children and Youth Act, came into effect in our province. Correspondingly, the title of the Children's Advocate is now known as the Saskatchewan Advocate for Children and Youth.

Over the past 38 years, Bob has been extensively involved with delivering services to the public. He has worked



poverty, mental illness, cognitive impairment, physical challenges, homelessness, and substance abuse can affect families. In 2009, his expertise was recognized through his appointment to serve as the Chair of the independent Child Welfare Review panel tasked with the comprehensive review of

child welfare in Saskatchewan. Bob has received many local, provincial and national awards for his advocacy work on behalf of children and families. He has a Bachelor and a Master's degree in Social Work, and he and his wife Tanya have three grown children and five grandchildren. The Youth Volunteer Program had a tremendously successful summer in 2015 and we anticipate that 2016 will be another banner year for the program. We hope to return to work with the organizations with whom we have established a relationship and hope to be able to add new ventures. During the school year the Youth Volunteer Program worked with the Children's Discovery Museum, the Parkinson's Society, Ronald McDonald House, the Saskatoon Convalescent Home, the Salvation Army, the Saskatoon Chamber Singers', the ORFF Conference and at the Sundog Craft Faire. While our activities are more limited during the school year due to time constraints, our YV's do enjoy helping whenever possible.

In October and November of 2015, some of our YVs participated in the Youth in Philanthropy Workshop organized by DCG Philanthropic and Child & Youth Friendly Saskatoon. At this workshop, the young people worked with charities and non-profit organizations of their choice. They gathered information about their chosen organization so that they could "pitch" to some very generous sponsors who agreed to give funds to these charitable and non-profit organizations for projects that organization has or wishes they could run. It is a wonderful learning

experience for all involved. 2015 was the second year of the YIP Pitch Party. It has been such a great success that we hope to continue it in the fall of 2016.

In May we hope to have some of our youth leaders go to schools in Saskatoon to recruit those who would like to join in the

adventures of the YVP. Last year we had a wonderful response and were able to welcome a number of new young people to the program. While recruitment is done largely through the schools, we also have a great response from those who have heard about the program from present and former YV's

The YVP Summer Program develops leadership skills and volunteerism among young people in our community.

We hire Team Leaders on Student Employment Grants and they, in turn, enlist over 70 young people, age 11-18, to volunteer for 20 or more charitable and non-profit groups that need assistance. Last year 70 youth donated over 1, 700 hours of volunteer work.

The grants pay 75% of the amount needed to employ them for 10 weeks during the summer school break and we raise the remainder through the annual dinner. We hope you will join us!
